ABOUT THE PROJECT

The project comprises the US 501 (Lynchburg Expressway) and US 221 (Lakeside Drive) intersection and extends north to the railroad bridges on Old Forest Road and the Desmond T. Doss Expressway, west to Jefferson Ridge Parkway, east to Country Place Lane, and south to just beyond the connector to Breezewood Drive.

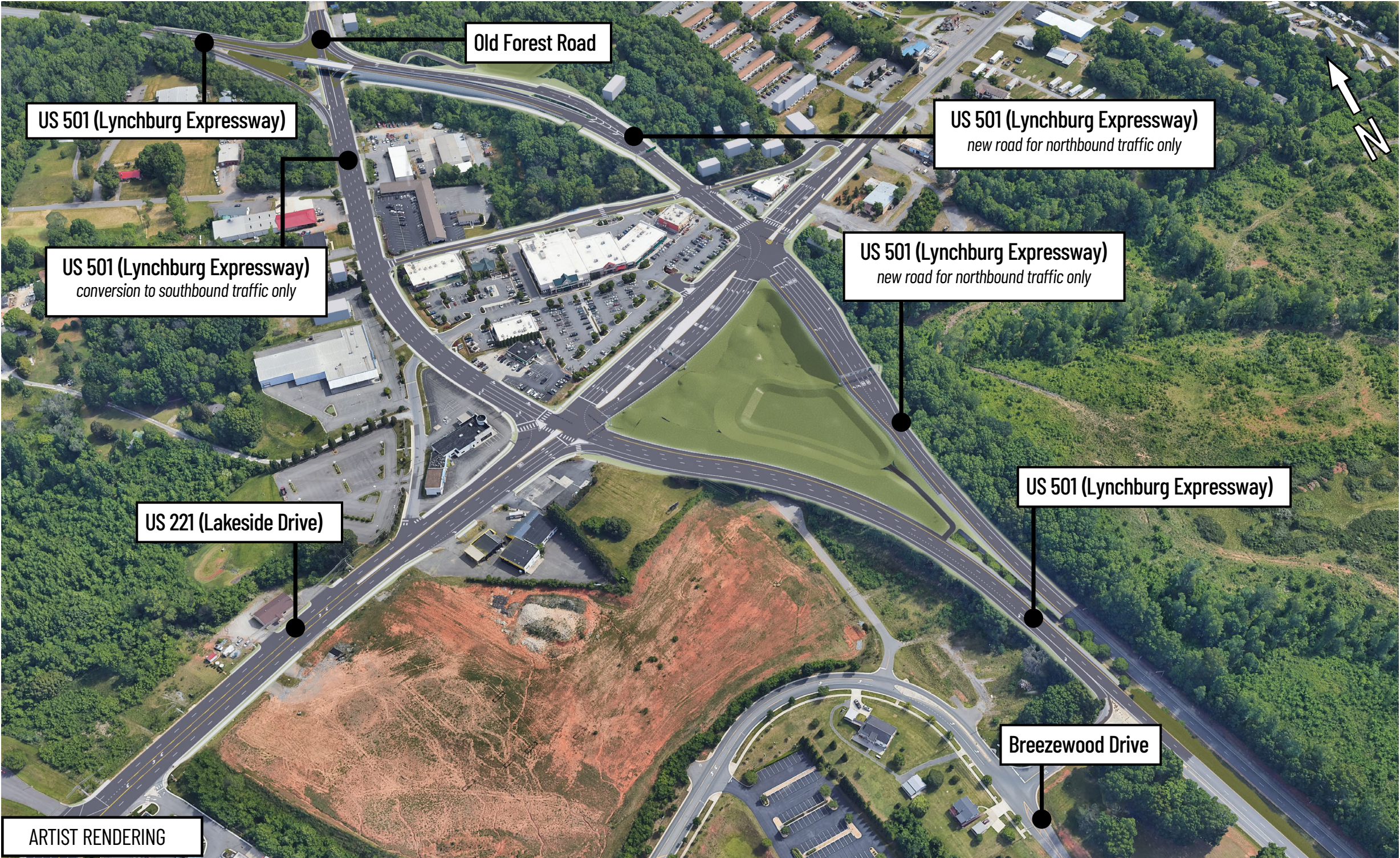
Continued commercial, retail, and housing growth has pushed the intersection over capacity. The purpose of the project is to improve safety, increase capacity, and reduce delays along US 501 and US 221.

Sustained regional economic development required the City of Lynchburg to redesign the intersection. The project is funded by a combination of city, state, and federal sources. It has been programmed in the City's Capital Improvements Plan (CIP) and is included in the City's adopted budget for 2027.

Community members were invited to attend a Public Information Meeting (PIM) held at Fire Station #7 on July 29, 2025, as well as a pop-up event at Lakeside Crossing Center beside Petco on October 22, 2025. During these meetings, attendees could review preliminary engineering designs and learn more about the project.

Maintenance of Traffic
Maintenance of Traffic operations will be conducted in multiple stages during construction. No detours are currently planned.

Environmental Review
A Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) was issued in 2020. The project team is currently preparing a reevaluation of the Environmental Assessment (EA) Document.

Flood Plain Impacts
The project is not expected to generate any negative impacts to the 100-year flood plain.

Right-of-Way
The project will require a combination of temporary and permanent easements, as well as right-of-way acquisitions.

New Federal Grant Award
In addition to the previously awarded federal and state funding, the City of Lynchburg has recently been awarded a \$24.5 million U.S. Department of Transportation Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development (BUILD) Grant for the US 501/ US 221 Split Pair Intersection Improvement Project, representing a major investment in one of the City's most significant transportation initiatives.

The federal investment will support the funding needed to move forward with this transformational project. The project has been in development for years and is designed to improve safety, mobility, and connectivity.
